With over 100 people attending each cabaret, including tributes to Shirley Bassey, Michael Bublé, Neil Sedaka and a couple of trips down memory lane with one of Wales's legends of cabaret, Johnny Tudor.

The principle is whatever we do in the evening, we can do in the day! This especially helps folk in and around the village who, for whatever reason, can't or prefer not to be travelling around at night-time.

Organised by Mark Thompson, who has recently formed "Ginatra" to try and promote live cabaret within local communities, as well as our very own local butcher, Glenn Griffith, the afternoons commence with lunch at 12.30pm. Glenn and his team serves "The Butchers Buffet" through till 1.30pm, when the show starts, under the lights of our very own village lighting technician, Alan Blakoe.

DPVC Volunteer News

DPVC at 50 -Part 2

It is 10 years since Alan Higgins wrote the history of Dinas Powys Voluntary Concern (DPVC). From its early beginnings at the health centre in 1972 to its anniversary, Alan gave comprehensive account of achievements, services provided and the names of the volunteers who were so important in the early years. To cover only 10 years should be an easier task but, in those years, DPVC has introduced new services, raised thousands of pounds through fundraising events, managed a pandemic and survived a flood!

The first Covid lockdown raised many questions for people. How were they going to manage to get food, medicines or other essential supplies? DPVC adapted to these requests and, as many existing volunteers were now shielding, it was decided that Wendy alone would drive the medical centre transport, collecting prescriptions and taking people to nurses' appointments. The community centre closed, but DPVC as an essential service, was allowed to use the building. Regular activities were suspended, including face to face befriending services and all social and fundraising activities.

Glamorgan Voluntary Services



began coordinating volunteers. Through these two organisations, over 200 volunteers came forward to help DPVC.

The need for new services was recognised by the coordinators. The community library was closed and many of the elderly who relied on it were shielding. The risk of isolation and exclusion was exacerbated by the continuing restrictions. As a result, The Borrowing Bus was born. After a hugely successful appeal for donations of books, jigsaws and games, volunteers took the minibus back on the road every Wednesday. meetings When outdoor were permitted, the Wellbeing Garden Project began in July 2021 as a way of delivering befriending services for older people in an outdoor environment.

Situated at Nightingale Community

Gardens, work began building raised beds and transporting soil with the help of volunteers from Dinas Powys Football Club, trustees and Wendy and Judith coordinating.

Funding was applied for from Community Foundation Wales and GVS and the project started with 6 people attending the garden every Friday. This later changed to the 1st and 3rd Friday of the month when regular gardeners meet to grow veg and chat. The Memory Café reopened in October 2021 for two Fridays a month. 2022 saw a return to outdoor events such as the Strawberry Tea and the Jubilee Party.

DPVC never stands still and in October 2022 another new project was launched. The Monday Soup Club Lunch takes place every week, run by Judith and Wendy and volunteers from both DPVC and the RVS. As 2022 draws to a close, Dinas Powys Voluntary Concern is still here working in the community, running community transport including shopping runs and health centre trips and being supported by dedicated volunteers Trustees including John Fanshaw who was chair when Alan finished his history in 2012.
